Prior to joining Chesapeake, Mr. Stice held a variety of technical and managerial positions at ConocoPhillips in exploration, production, midstream, and gas marketing from May 1981 to October 2008. Mr. Stice served as President of ConocoPhillips Qatar in Doha, Qatar from November 2006 to October 2008. While serving in Qatar, Mr. Stice was responsible for the development, management, and construction of natural gas liquefaction and regasification (LNG) projects. While at ConocoPhillips, he served as Vice President of Global Gas LNG, as President of Gas and Power, and President of Conoco Energy Solutions, in addition to other roles in ConocoPhillips' midstream business units. Mr. Stice also served as President of Conoco Asia Pacific Ltd, based in Singapore, and as managing director of Conoco Australia, a Conoco subsidiary in Brisbane, Australia. Through previous overseas assignments, he gained an invaluable understanding of the global energy arena.

Mr. Stice is a registered professional engineer in the state of Texas, a member of the University of Oklahoma Board of Visitors for the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy and the College of Engineering, and a member of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers.
